

#### 2016 **Programs**



Our Children's Mental Health programs helped 766 children and their families manage serious emotional disturbance or behavioral disorders at home. Case management tailors the supports and services necessary for the child to be cared for in the community, avoiding hospitalization and residential treatment.



We provided a home for 150 adolescents and adults with developmental disabilities in the most inclusive settings possible. Our Day Habilitation program worked with 41 residents to develop skills to reach their fullest potential. Service Coordination assisted 81 individuals in our residences and at home in the community.



# Therapeutic K-12 School

Our Therapeutic K-12 School met the academic, social-emotional, and physical needs of 98 students with autism, neurological impairments and other disabilities who were unable to be cared for in a traditional public school setting. All 21 high school students participated in employment training.



## Adult Mental Health

Our Adult Mental Health programs helped 105 individuals challenged by mental illness live in the most independent community settings possible. The Community Residences and Supported Housing programs assist with counseling in medication management and other life skills to maintain good mental health and avoid hospitalizations.



## **Foster Care & Prevention**

The Foster Care program brought stability to the lives of 426 children who have survived neglect or abuse. Every effort is made to reunite families where possible, or to find loving and supportive foster families when not. Our Preventive Services program helped 85 families to overcome challenges and keep them together.



Our Therapeutic Preschool provided educational and clinical services to 49 children with special needs. We served 93 children in our Pre-K program which includes family engagement activities that support children's learning. The special education evaluation center served 79 children who may be in need of special education services.


